Pastoral Care

The happiness of the children is paramount at Salesian. We are known for our excellent pastoral care system, led by Heads of Year who are charged with ensuring that every single child in their care gets the best possible support. Children meet daily with their Form

Tutors who are responsible for helping them make a smooth start to every day and for closely monitoring every child's progress and welfare. Tutor time is also used for prayer and reflection, advising students on how to get the most out of their learning and to promote the wider social skills needed to be happy and successful in life.

Learning

A broad, balanced and relevant curriculum ensures that every child is well catered for. The school has a reputation for academic excellence due to high standards of teaching and hardworking children, all of whom are expected to make the most of every opportunity. We expect every child to achieve excellent results and qualifications regardless of our comprehensive intake so we ensure that each individual enjoys very best support regardless of their needs. Becoming an independent learner is an essential skill for children to develop and the completion of regular homework is vital for children's academic success. We place a high priority on communication and aim to work with parents to support the children's learning wherever possible. The school app allows parents a straightforward means to monitor homework, achievement and attendance data.

Spiritual Life

As a Catholic school, Christ's example and the philosophy of St. John Bosco are central to everything we do. The values and challenges of the Gospel shape our whole approach to education. Our Chaplaincy team ensure that children are able to share in meaningful Liturgy and regular assemblies. Feast and Holy Days are celebrated with school Mass for all students. The St Francis de Sales Chapel is at the heart of our school, next to the Hall and is a place of both quiet reflection and celebration, and we encourage students to make use of it whenever they can. We take the challenge to be "Christ in our World" seriously and each year students raise considerable sums for a variety of charities and good causes.



Careers Education & Guidance

We want our students to fully understand the world of possibilities out there and make the most of their talents. We aim to help develop students' knowledge, understanding, confidence and skills so that they make well-informed choices and go onto positive destinations.

We are committed to providing a well-structured Careers and Education programme for all students in Year 7 to 13 headed up by a Careers Lead who works closely with the Leadership Team and academic departments. We strive to ensure students experience a full, varied and interesting careers journey, having the opportunity to explore their own interests, skills and passions; understanding the wealth of jobs and educational pathways available to them once they leave school. Our Careers and Education programme is integrated into our students' experience across the whole curriculum through the work of our newly appointed Subject Career Ambassadors and is based on a partnership with students and their parents or carers. We have a rich partnership with local businesses, colleges and universities along with a strong alumni and wider school community to support our Careers Education.

Co-Curricular

Our ethos places great emphasis on opportunities for children to not only demonstrate and develop a broad range of skills but also to relax and enjoy themselves! There is an extensive range of co-curricular activity on offer including opportunities to develop sporting, musical, dramatic, artistic, intellectual and social skills in clubs and activities at lunch times and after school. All this activity supports a proud tradition of competitive sporting success, highly acclaimed dramatic and musical performance and a flourishing Duke of Edinburgh Award programme. A wealth of trips at home and abroad further enriches the children's experience.



Salesian College

The vast majority of our students graduate to our College where they have the opportunity to study a wide range of Advanced Level courses. From a vocational perspective, we offer a BTEC curriculum and T Levels, a new technical qualification in which students gain 45 days' industry experience alongside their classroom studies. Our College students benefit from the same academic rigour, pastoral care, spiritual development and extra-curricular activity that they have enjoyed during their time at the school. A well-developed post-18 guidance programme supplements this and provides an excellent base for moving on to university, apprenticeships or the world of work. Mathematics

Rooms 5 & 6

Staff and students will be happy to talk to you about Maths. In Rooms 5 & 6 there will be opportunities to investigate probability, complete our puzzles, see the work and resources that students use, and watch Maths in motion. Science Block

Science

Rooms S1, S2

Science gives students the opportunity to study how the world around us works. In Biology you study the human body as well as looking at how plants adapt and survive. Chemistry looks at the tiny particles the world is made up of, and how they combine to create different materials. In Physics you will look at how to explain the movement of objects, as well as studying electricity and space. There are many experiments and games to get you excited, so come along and see science in action! Students and staff will be on hand to help with the experiments and answer your questions.

Room 16

The Modern Foreign Languages department are looking forward to welcoming you into Casa Bosco. During your visit, you will have the opportunity to meet staff and to look at some of our resources and students' work. Thomas Building

Product Design

Room T₃

Year 7 students create a bedside lamp, to do this they learn basic electronics skills, and learn about the world of art and design movements. In year 8 students put their accuracy skills to the test and create a steady hand game. They will learn to create a full set of technical CAD drawings. In year 9 students delve into the world of architecture where they practise skills through making a postcard and research various famous architects while developing their idea generation and modelling skills.

Food and Nutrition

Room T₅

In our fully equipped kitchen, Year 7 students learn where food comes from, how to cook a range of dishes safely and hygienically and to apply their knowledge of healthy eating. Year 8 students explore food science through the use of different raising agents. They complete raising agent experiments and also bake various items using chemical, biological and mechanical raising agents. By year 9, students are confident chefs and therefore after learning about a variety of diets and cultures – They select one and make a series of meals from their chosen diet or culture.

Graphics

Room T₇

At Key Stage 3, sketching, typography, technical drawings, and the use of Adobe Illustrator and Photoshop are all part of the experience. Through designing and making a bookmark in Year 7 to developing their graphical hand skills in Year 8 and designing and making packaging in Yr 9, KS₃ prepares them for KS₄ where they will design and make their own products using both CAD/CAM and traditional drawing/workshop skills.

Resistant Materials Technology

Room T₂

Students are introduced at KS₃ to the wide scope of designing and making practical products. Year 7 are exploring basic metal working skills, to create an enamelled key ring. Year 8 are working on a focused practical task that involves designing and making bookends from wood on their chosen theme. The Year 9 scheme of work looks at how keeping organised and utilising many workshop tools to create a desk tidy.

Textiles Technology

Room T4

KS3 students design and make products with a range of materials. Year 7 create an applied denim pencil case out of denim, developing their hand sewing skills and learning how to use a sewing machine. Year 8 are making ski hats to develop sewing machine skills, and Year 9 are designing and making a pyjama set using a range of techniques, both old and new. Students recycle a T-Shirt using tie dye and design and make pyjama bottoms using polar fleece. Across Key Stage 3 students learn about fibres, fabrics, construction methods and smart materials as well as industry practice.



Sports

Physical Education

Gym & Astro-Turf Pitches

The Physical Education department offers a range of academic pathways at Key Stage 4 and 5 through the OCR exam board. We have a wide variety of physical activities for both boys and girls including: Trampolining, Rugby, Hockey, Athletics, Netball, Dance and many more. In addition to the skills they will develop in lessons there are also a large number of extra-curricular clubs that take place before school, during lunchtimes and after school which allow you to enjoy as many sports as you can fit into the week. Basketball and Trampolining can be found in the Gym and Cricket/Rugby/Hockey/Football on the Astro-Turf pitches at various times. Art, Drama and Music

Art

Room 25, 26 & 27

The world of Art is introduced to students at Key Stage 3 through termly themed work. Each project builds on creative formal techniques (drawing, painting, 3-dimensional work and mixing media). The department encourages independent creative research and encourages sustained investigation and, as a result, students produce highly individual sketchbook work and exciting final pieces at GCSE. Come and sample the creative environment in the Salesian School Art department and get involved in the activities. There will be displays and digital presentations of KS3 & KS4 work, as well as a chance to see the sort of work involved in GCSE Photography.



Drama

Room 22 & 23

The Drama Department are very proud to be showcasing our Year 7 Drama club students tonight. Please come along and join us as we create a hall of statues, ready to perform at the drop of a hat and make you the stars of the show! Drama at Salesian is taught up to twice a week and challenges students to perform to high standards, interpreting and reacting to other actors while developing physical discipline over the course of Year 7. Students engage with many stimuli over KS3 with script, poetry, devised work and spontaneous improvisation being developed from the outset. Extra-curricular Drama is really important to us here, with Year 7 Drama club running every week and the chance to perform in the whole school show every year. Drama teachers will be on hand tonight to happily speak to you should you have any questions.



Music

Room M39

The Music department will be you showing you not only the things that pupils cover in lessons in Years 7-9, but also showcasing a sample of the wide variety of extra-curricular activities we have going on throughout the week. In addition, samples of work, African drums and keyboards will be on display.



Computing & Humanities

Religious Education

Room 30 & 31

We look forward to welcoming you into the Religious Education Department where there are always opportunities to explore the Salesian ethos that is at the heart of Salesian School. Computing

The field of programming is a growing area which offers fantastic career opportunities. IT also enables young people to enhance their learning skills and knowledge, helping to develop them into autonomous and discerning adults in the years to come. In addition to our comprehensive careers offering, we also invest in the development of the whole student. At Salesian, our Personal Social Health and Economic education (PSHE) curriculum recognises the development of each pupil as integral to their academic and pastoral wellbeing. Our aim is for students to leave Salesian as happy, successful and well-rounded citizens who are ready to manage life's challenges and make the most of every opportunity that comes their way. We support this by providing all students (Y7-13) with a weekly lesson delivered by their tutors, to develop the knowledge and skills to lead a safe, healthy, productive and fulfilled life. Our curriculum is also supported by external speakers who deliver messages drawing from their professional expertise, life experience and careers choices.

The Duke of Edinburgh Award

St. Patricks

At Salesian school, we have a proud history of extensive participation in the Duke of Edinburgh Award. Under the responsibility of a dedicated team, the 'D of E' Award provides you with extensive opportunities to build towards a world renowned qualification. The school runs a full Duke of Edinburgh participation scheme, from the Bronze Award to the Gold Award. Examination Results

At Salesian school, we understand the importance of outstanding academic qualifications. Despite not having externally assessed exams for the past 2 years, the school consistently performs extremely well at both Key Stage 4 and Key Stage 5. These results are a reflection of the school ethos and vision in action. As we journey towards external assessments in 2022, we would hope that this consistently strong performance is, once again, reflected in student outcomes. Highlights from 2019 (the last externally published results) were:

-  A Progress 8 figure of **+0.95**. This means that, on average, each student in every subject achieved nearly a whole grade higher than they were expected to. This figure places the school comfortably in the top 1% of schools nationally
-  90% of students achieved 5 9-4 (A*-C) grades (including English and Maths)
-  70% of students achieved 5 9-5 (A*-B) grades (including English and Maths)
-  40% of all grades were 9-7, the old A*-A
-  66% of all A-Level grades were A*-B

Year 7 Entry September 2022

Application to the school is by the completion and submission of **two** forms:

- a. the Surrey (or other Local Authority) Common Admissions Form (C.A.F.)
- b. the school's Supplementary Information Form

The CAF should ideally be returned to the relevant authority by **31st October 2021**.

The school's Supplementary Information Form is downloadable from our website. It must be returned to the school office by **22nd October 2021**.
