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NATIONAL NEWS

[ONS Labour Market statistics – April 2021](#)

The main points are:

- 56,000 fewer people were in pay-rolled employment in March 2021 when compared with February 2021.
- The UK employment rate was estimated at 75.1%, 1.4 percentage points lower than a year earlier and 0.1 percentage points lower than the previous quarter.
- The UK unemployment rate was estimated at 4.9%, 0.9 percentage points higher than a year earlier but 0.1 percentage points lower than the previous quarter.
- The UK economic inactivity rate was estimated at 20.9%, 0.7 percentage points higher than a year earlier and 0.2 percentage points higher than the previous quarter.
- There were an estimated 607,000 job vacancies in January to March 2021, which is a 22.7% fall compared with a year ago.
- Growth in average total pay (including bonuses) among employees for the three months December 2020 to February 2021 was 4.5%, and growth in regular pay (excluding bonuses) was 4.4%; it is estimated that by removing the compositional effect, the underlying wage growth is around 2.5% for total and regular pay.

[Screwfix expansion plans](#)

Screwfix are opening 50 new stores across Ireland and the UK creating around 600 customer service, supervisory and retail management jobs. The stores will be open from January next year.



[Demand for Security staff](#)

According to the UK Door Security Association (UKDSA) over half of door security positions may not be filled due to a year of closure of nightclubs and bars which have resulted in staff moving on to other work.

[Roadchef recruiting across the UK](#)

1,000 new staff are to be recruited by Motorway service provider Roadchef across the UK.

[Large increase in women taking up construction trades](#)

A study by @GoCompare finds there has been a 366% increase in females taking up apprenticeships in construction and engineering over the last five years. In 2019/20 10,180 females started courses in construction and a further 45,010 in engineering. Many women take up Painting and Decorating (33%) and second place are Plumbers (28.38%). [A career in the Electrotechnical industry](#)

For those wondering which career path to take or looking to retrain due to redundancy, a career in the Electrotechnical industry might be an option worth considering. With the starting salary for an Electrical apprentice at around £10,000 in the first year, rising to £22,000 in the final year and a salary of £33,495 for a full-time electrician for an Electrical Engineer¹ there is good money to be earned. More skilled managers can earn more than this.

Labour market statistics for this industry indicate that between 12,500 and 15,000 additional skilled electricians will be needed over the next few years over and above the usual recruitment intake.

A popular route into the industry is via an apprenticeship (currently 5,000 to 6,000 starts every year). This can be progressed to HNC, HND, degree and master's degrees in subjects such as Electrical Engineering or Building Services Engineering. Progression to become an Incorporated or Chartered Engineer is also an option. If every apprentice completed their apprenticeship there would still be a shortfall in the requirement of up to 10,000 and, of course, not all complete the course whilst others leave the profession or retire.

The T Level in Building Services Engineering launches in September this year, providing a good opportunity to enhance competency at entry level which can lead to opportunities for further study at an advanced level. As the world changes and revolutionises its carbon footprint the skillset of an Electrician is transferable to emerging occupations such as electrical vehicle charging, smart building, solar panels and electrification of heat. E-mobility, Smart Technology and Wi-fi Technology are major drivers as the top three forces for change.² A wide variety of roles present opportunities within the management/directorship, estimating, design as well as the self-employment route. [Teacher training sector on the rise](#)

Research shows that the Covid-19 recession has fired up an interest in teacher training with UCAS figures showing a 35% year on year increase between March and August last year. The Department for Education (DfE) also find that there were 41,472 new entrants for 1920/2021 compared with 33,799 in 2019/20. Trainee

[The construction sector](#)

The Further education learners into the construction workforce was a report published back in June 2020 but given that it has been an exceptional year then it's worth bringing back to the attention. Written for the CITB, it looked at what was happening to 16 -18 year old learners participating on construction courses in further education. The starting point was the leaky pipeline i.e: that three out of five learners who study construction do not go on to find work in the sector. The report is an easy read and some of the findings will be familiar particularly the value of family connections. The CITB's response is [here](#). *"The most striking aspect of the research was that it highlighted a big gap between the skills and experience college students have at the end of their courses and the expectations of employers on day one. This is the crux of the problem, and where real progress is now being made"*. Closer ties between employers and education continues to be a major issue and the CITB hopes that measures such as traineeships will contribute to greater employment readiness for students progressing into Level 2 qualifications and on into work.

More recently, the CITB published [Building Skills for Net Zero](#). In this response to the Government's 2050 net zero target, the CITB's modelling suggests that an additional 350,000 FTE workers will be needed by 2028, to be mainly involved in delivering improvements to existing buildings that will reduce energy demand. That represents an increase of around 13% on the current size of the workforce. Most of the effort to decarbonise will be focused on the energy efficiency retrofit of existing buildings. - around 27 million residential and two million non-residential buildings to reduce emissions over the next 30 years. A combination of new skills and new workers - the largest group of which will be plumbing and heating engineers.

[Pizza Express recruitment drive](#)

Pizza Express have a drive to recruit 1,000 people as we come out of the Covid-19 restrictions. 300 of these will be recruited as part of the Kickstart scheme.

[Apprenticeships and Traineeships](#)

The latest figures from the DfE on apprenticeships and traineeships covering the first two quarters of the academic year i.e: August to January. Overall, as might be expected, the number of starts on apprenticeships is down - 18.5% lower compared to first six months of the 2019/20 apprenticeship year. Nationally, what was two years ago a 30/70 split for starts by under 19s compared to over 19s, has widened and to date, 76% of starts are by people aged 19+. Traineeship starts have remained unchanged with around 8,800 starts in England to date.

[Disability Support](#)

DWP is increasing the number of Disability Employment Advisors (DEAs) by 315 to take the total to over 1,000. Its aim is to see an additional 1,000,000 disabled people in work by 2027. There are 20,000 employers who have signed up to the Disability Confident scheme.

The DWP are recruiting 150 specialist Youth Employability Coaches across the UK to provide intensive employment support of up to six months to young job seekers.

ONS regional labour market statistics – main points for April 2021

- For the three months ending February 2021, the highest employment rate estimate in the UK was in the South East (78.4%).
- For the three months ending February 2021, the highest unemployment rate estimate in the UK was in London (7.2%) and the lowest was in the South East (3.4%).
- For the three months ending February 2021, the lowest economic inactivity rate estimate in the UK was in the South East (18.8%); most regions saw an increase in the economic inactivity rate compared with the same period last year.
- Between September and December 2020, workforce jobs decreased in most regions of the UK, with the largest decrease of 60,000 seen in London.

Dominos to open new stores

Dominos Pizza Group are planning to open an additional 200 new stores across the UK and Ireland post-pandemic. This includes two sites in [Sussex](#) - one in Crawley and one in Brighton.

South West named best place in UK for women to work

The South West has been named as the best place in the UK for women to work according to a new report by PwC which finds the female labour participation rate is 79% in the South West, the highest in the country. Interestingly the full-time employment rate for women is the lowest in the country at 56%.

South West retail units in demand

Business Live reports on three reasons which account for the growing demand in retail units in the South West's affluent seaside resorts. Staycations, London 'fallout'



and pent-up spending are cited as the reasons that retailers are seeking premises in South Cornwall and Devon as well as roadside units for restaurants and takeaways.

BOURNEMOUTH DORSET AND POOLE

[Weymouth Gateway retail development approved by councillors](#)

Councillors have approved Weymouth Gateway, a retail development which would see branches of Dunelm, B & M Homestore, McDonalds and a Costa drive-through open up, and thus creating new jobs for the area. The proposal now has to be approved by the Secretary of State for communities.

[Transformation of Bournemouth's Savoy Hotel](#)

Over 200 local jobs are to be created with the refurbishment of The Savoy Hotel on Bournemouth's Westcliff. A 'soft development' phase will enable the hotel to open for the summer season before it closes in September for a transformation into a brand new luxurious five-star hotel.

A workshop for those wishing to start their own business is to be held on 21st May in Weymouth. **'Time to start a business, time to change your life'** is free to those living within a 15 mile radius of the town.

[Dorset hospitality sectors struggles to recruit](#)

Plymouth's tourist industry is being targeted in a bid to create an 'apres sea experience' for visitors which includes a need for more hotels, and more small music venues. A Premier Inn is already coming as well as a hotel in the Brunel Plaza. The aim is to create 1,000 new 'quality, year-round jobs' over the next ten years and to attract visitors from the USA, Canada and China as well as Europe. Somerset's growth sectors

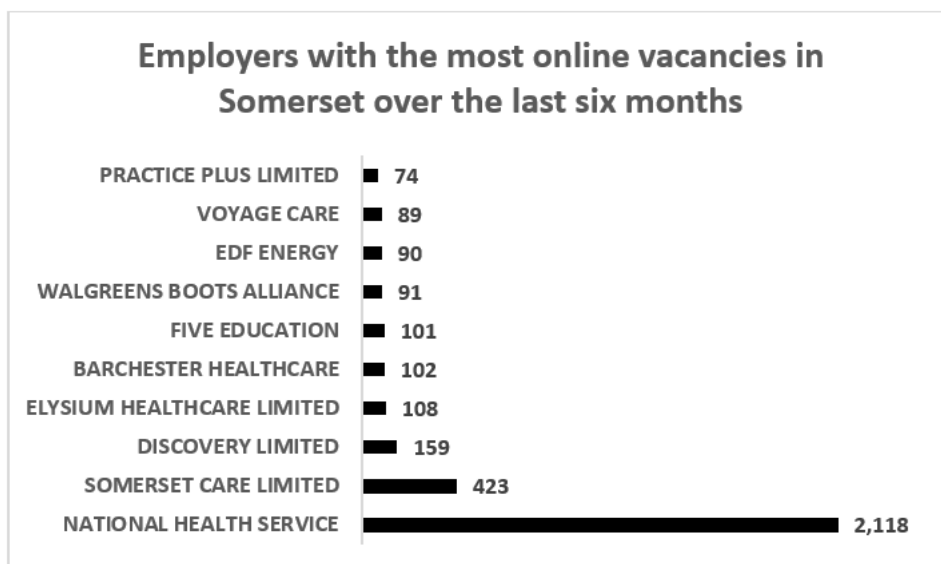
As Somerset emerges from the pandemic Somerset's local authorities have produced their recovery plan which highlights the growth areas for the county. These are:
